SUBJECT: 2012 OPM GUARDIAN AWARD

This notice solicits nominations for the 2012 U.S. Office of Personnel Management (OPM) Guardian Award. OPM's Federal Investigative Services (FIS) instituted this award in 1998 to promote the OPM goal of an effective Federal civilian workforce through agency excellence in security and suitability programs. The award focuses on agency achievements in program implementation, policy development, operations, or process automation that result in enhanced timeliness, capability, capacity, quality, and/or reciprocity.

Any employee may nominate an agency operation or program; program officials may nominate their own program or those of others. Nominations should clearly address:

- The area or issue being addressed/improved
- Root cause of the inefficiency or problem
- · Desired outcome
- Plan of action
- Implementation results
- Comprehensive performance measures that demonstrate results and are specific enough to allow verification of the achievements and contributions cited
- Strategic administration goals supported by this accomplishment

A panel consisting of OPM representatives and a representative of an outside agency will evaluate nominations based on the value of the contribution considering innovation, results, and alignment with strategic administration goals within the context of compliance with applicable Federal regulations and directives. Efficiencies and enhancements will be considered in light of the size of the agency and the scope of operations; therefore, we encourage submissions from all programs.

Use the attached form to forward nominations by August 3, 2013, to the Guardian Award Committee. Narrative attached to the nomination form should be double spaced, using 12 pitch font, and limited to no more than 10 pages. The mailing address, fax number, and email address for submitting nominations is provided on the nomination form. The winner(s) will be notified and then formally recognized at the Suitability/Security Professionals Seminar in November 2013.

I encourage your participation in this effort to recognize those agencies, organizations, and programs leading the way in finding effective, efficient, and innovative solutions to our modern Federal personnel security and suitability needs.
