As America's Gatekeeper, the Defense Counterintelligence and Security Agency (DCSA) works tirelessly to protect both our workforce and industrial base from internal and external threats. We are active-duty military, civilian employees and contractors whose mission is to preserve our nation's arsenal of democracy by mitigating threats to classified and unclassified information and related technology.

Within DCSA, the Industrial Security (IS) mission area is charged with administering the National Industrial Security Program (NISP). The NISP is the authority in the United States for managing private industry's access to classified information. This book is a compilation of all the executive branch departments and agencies that trust DCSA to protect, vet, educate and support them through administration of the NISP. As you peruse its pages, note the diversity of missions, functions and roles. Whether it is improved methods of doing business such as continuous vetting of our cleared facilities or updates to tools national policy requirements, such as 32 Code of Federal Regulations Part 117, the National Industrial Security Program Operating Manual (NISPOM), DCSA's IS directorate is dedicated to improving our processes, educating and building the capabilities of our workforce and making a difference for our NISP partners. This is our mission. I am confident the DCSA Industrial Security team is uniquely positioned to rule this arena.

Industrial Security (IS) Mission

IS conducts risk management activities with respect to the U.S. government's Defense Industrial Base (DIB), including critical technologies and the defense supply chain, through oversight of the NISP; issuance of facility security clearances; foreign ownership, control and influence mitigation measures; information system cybersecurity oversight; and other activities related to protecting classified and controlled unclassified national security information and related technology.

National Industrial Security Program (NISP)

The NISP was established by Executive Order 12829 to ensure that cleared U.S. defense industry safeguards the classified information in their possession while performing work on contracts, programs, bids or research and development efforts.

Five U.S. government executive branch agencies—DOD, DOE, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC), the Office of the Director of National Intelligence (ODNI) and the Department of Homeland Security (DHS)—are designated as cognizant security agencies (CSAs) and have specific responsibilities within the NISP.

As the largest of the CSAs, the DOD delegates this security cognizance to DCSA as its cognizant security office.

DCSA administers the NISP on behalf of the DOD and 34 other federal agencies. There are approximately 12,500 contractor facilities that are cleared for access to classified information under DCSA's security oversight responsibilities. DCSA provides field personnel, government contracting activities and cleared contractors with timely, consistent policy guidance and effective NISP interpretation.



Defense Counterintelligence and Security Agency Industrial Security (IS)

Introduction

The defense ecosystem encompasses the DOD, DIB, the NISP and public-private partnerships that support the federal government. It is a complex network of interconnected industrial organizations – government and civilian. DCSA has the mission to secure the trustworthiness and integrity of the federal workforce and cleared DIB entities.

IS plays the leading role in ensuring the security of this ecosystem. IS provides the oversight and compliance-based leadership for defense security-related facilities, operations and information needed to defeat adversary actions and intelligence operations. IS aspires to lead DCSA in expanding and transforming its role in the larger industrial security ecosystem. This aspiration involves reducing threats from classified and unclassified sources that may include scholars, front companies, supply chain, foreign investment, cyber and espionage.

What Does this Mean for Our Nation's Security?

These companies and organizations, with their own internal systems and processes, work closely with DOD to deliver critical capabilities and systems. The amount of sensitive data and technology accessed by government and contractors alike is staggering. As the number of actors and interactions increase, so can threats to our national security.

As threats from foreign entities become more complex, diverse and harmful to U.S. interests, partners across the government must continue to remain vigilant.

How the NISP and DCSA IS Make a Difference?

The NISP, established by Executive Order 12829, ensures the cleared U.S. defense industry safeguards the classified information in their possession needed to work on contracts, programs, bids or research and development efforts. The NISP is executed by five executive branch agencies called Cognizant Security Agencies. DOD has the largest NISP contractor population where DCSA serves as the Cognizant Security Office. IS provides our partner agencies with the following services:

- Administer the NISP.
- Provide security oversight.
- Conduct security review actions.
- Provide security education and training.
- Provide supplementary procedures for unique mission requirements.
- Assess, authorize, and oversee contractor information systems used to process classified information.
- Make temporary national security eligibility determinations.
- · Conduct background investigations, adjudications and continuous vetting.


