# BIOGRAPHY



## **DONALD J. REIDY**

### **SENIOR ADVISOR**

Donald J. Reidy is the Senior Advisor for the Defense Counterintelligence and Security Agency (DCSA), assuming the role on May 11, 2026. In this capacity, Mr. Reidy helps shape DCSA planning, operations, customer support, and resource allocation.

Prior to DCSA, Mr. Reidy served as the director of strategic planning and programming for U.S. Naval Special Warfare Command (NSWC) from 2012 to 2025. NSWC staffs, trains, equips, and sustains Navy SEALs and other specialized units. He guided the organization through a series of strategic shifts and operational challenges. Through rigorous assessments and the divestment of legacy capabilities, he helped redirect

funding to investments in next-generation capabilities like autonomous systems, low visibility mobility, and advanced sensors. Overall, the NSWC annual budget grew from \$1.1 billion to \$3.6 billion.

During a 28-year Navy career, Mr. Reidy built a track record of leading complex logistics and business operations across the broader military enterprise. As NSWC's Assistant Chief of Staff for Logistics, Engineering & Combat Systems, he managed a \$12.4B global facility infrastructure and \$582M construction program while sustaining a \$2B portfolio of advanced mobility platforms and combat systems across two theaters of sustained combat operations. As the chief operating officer for Navy Region Northwest, he implemented budgeting processes that saved 17% annually across a \$235 million enterprise and integrated nearby military installations to reduce overhead. During an earlier tour as NSWC Director, Logistics Plans and Operations, he consolidated and streamlined logistics functions across the force to create an expeditionary Combat Service Support capability. These efforts enabled NSW forces to more rapidly deploy and execute sustained operations in austere environments in the immediate aftermath of 9/11. As a senior supply chain expert at the U.S. Special Operations Command, he was the senior logistics and supply chain expert on a team that reduced the delivery time of revolutionary combatant craft by 40%, an effort that earned his team the Department of Defense's David Packard Excellence in Acquisition Award.

He began his active-duty Navy career in 1980. Over his first decade of service, he directed supply chain operations across the Mediterranean region, managed logistics for several extended ship deployments, and served as a special assistant to the commander of the Navy's 54,000-person global supply chain enterprise.

Mr. Reidy earned a master's degree in business administration from Harvard Business School, a master's degree in national security and strategic affairs from the U.S. Naval War College and a bachelor's degree in economics from the University of Rochester.
