NAESOC OVERVIEW

DCSA is the cognizant security office for over 12,500 facilities. A significant percentage of those locations (approximately 8,000) do not possess classified information on site. Supporting DCSA's oversight approach, select non-possessing ("access elsewhere") facilities are provided security management and support by a dedicated, integrated operations center. By separating oversight for possessing and non-possessing facilities, DCSA provides more appropriate support, while protecting the critical technologies vital to national security.

Onsite Possessors

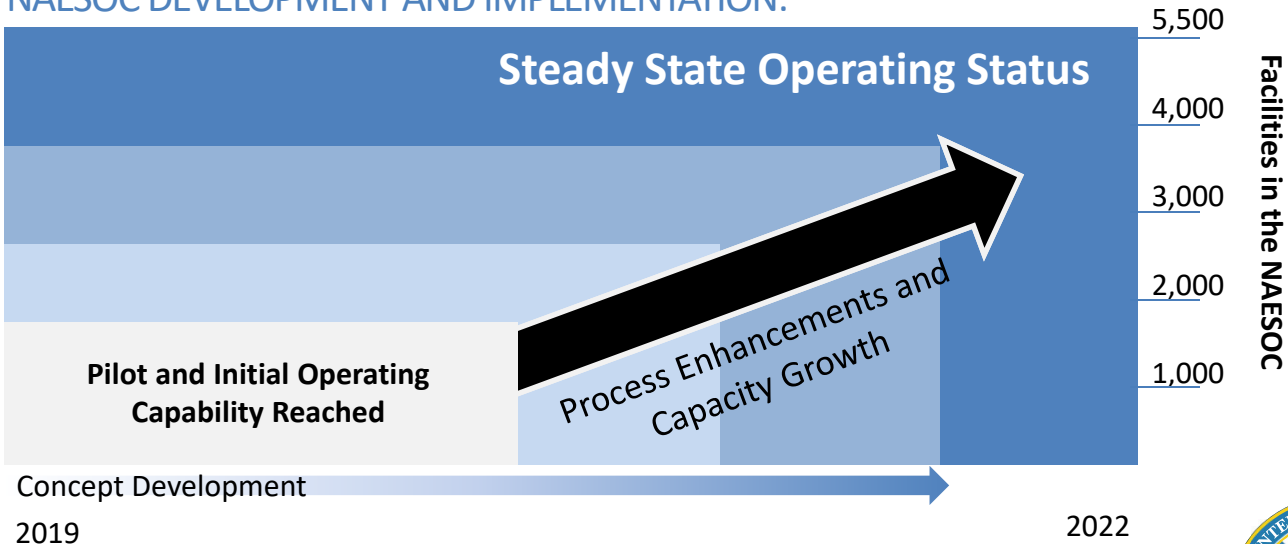
HOW IT WORKS:

Access elsewhere facilities are vetted against NAESOC criteria to determine eligibility for transfer. Once in the NAESOC, they are monitored for changes, risk indicators, trends, and anomalies. NAESOC coordinates with government contracting activities, program managers, and DOD partners to ensure stakeholders are informed of facility status and program compliance and provided with timely risk-based recommendations.

NAESOC BENEFITS:

- Centralized processing and tracking for vulnerability identification and mitigation.
- Customized education resources for government and industry partners.
- Optimized communications, threat reporting, and changes to facility profiles.
- Dedicated call center staff providing real-time support.
